
Greeting Metrc Users,

The purpose of this bulletin is to address questions regarding pre-packaging, re-packaging medical product and harvest batches.

Pre-packaging product

- 1. This is not a requirement but will allow licensee's to use fewer tags
- 2. Packages of buds and shake/trim may be packaged by gross weight in Metrc.
- 3. You may create multiple line items in your POS that can be associated with a single Metrc item and a single Metrc package tag.

In Metrc - Create a single package with all of the bulk inventory




In the Point-of-Sale – You may create multiple line items of pre-packaged product for each strain

- 1. You may designate the amount of marijuana product contained in each item that is being sold from the POS by entering the usable weight of marijuana contained within
 - These fields are often labelled as "usable marijuana" or "usable weight"
- These items in the POS can share the same Metrc Package ID
 - For Example:
 - Blue Dream 1g 1 unit (1 gram of usable marijuana) Package 1830
 - Blue Dream 1/8th 1 unit (3.5 grams of usable marijuana) **Package 1830**
 - Blue Dream 1/4th 1 unit (7 grams of usable marijuana) **Package 1830**
- 3. Each time one of these items is sold from the POS, the sale will be reported to Metrc by gross weight sold under a single Package
 - For Example:
 - Blue Dream 1/8th 1 unit sold (3.5 grams) **Package 1830**
 - Blue Dream 1/4th 1 unit sold (7 grams) Package 1830



 In Metrc these sales will then be reported simply as 10.5 grams sold from package 1830 and the quantity deducted from the gross weight



- The processes, functionality and terminology in each POS system will vary and may affect your success and accuracy if set up incorrectly
- Please confer with your POS provider for instructions on how to perform this setup in your respective POS
- This process may not work for everyone but will allow those facilities who have Medical tags to still use them



Re-packaging & Transferring product from Medical to Recreational

Cultivators operating as dual-licensees (Medical & Recreational) facilities who have ordered medical tags but intend to package and sell their harvested product as recreational product may use the following process to use up any medical tags.

- 1. The plants will need to be entered into the medical license in Metrc
 - These plants must be tagged with Medical Plant Tags
- The plants will be harvested and packaged as Medical product initially
 - The harvested product must be packaged with a medical Metrc package tag
- 3. The package must then be transferred to the associated, dual-licensed, recreational license within Metrc




4. The Package will then be received under the Recreational License in Metro



- This is an electronic transfer in Metrc from the medical license to the recreational license
- The Packages should not leave the facility during this transfer to the recreational license
- Packages must never be transferred out of a recreational license unless they have recreational package tags



Once the Packages have been transferred to Retail they must then be repackaged with a Retail Package Tag



 After they have Repackaged the product as Retail, they may then transfer the product using the normal processes

Testing

- All packages that are transferred from medical to recreational must still be tested in accordance with the rules and regulations before being transferred out of your facility.
- You may create samples and have the product tested under the medical license before transferring to the recreational license in Metrc

Harvests

- 1. Harvest Batches must be recorded strain specific
 - You may not create multi-strain Harvest Batches
- 2. All Harvest Batches must record the wet weight for each individual plant in the Harvest
 - Harvest weights may not be averaged, rounded, estimated, guessed or entered randomly
- 3. Waste must be recorded by Harvest Batch not by each individual plant
- 4. Moisture loss should not be recorded as waste (only report waste you create)
