Purpose: Clarify and Define; Creation of Test Samples, Transfer Medical to Rec, Harvesting		

Greeting Metrc Users,

The purpose of this bulletin is to clarify the following; Creation of Test Samples, Transferring Medical to Rec, Harvesting and to provide clear definition of specific terminology within the State rules and Metrc.

Terminology

Package

- A **Package** is an item specific Batch of Cannabis products:
 - Cannabis, Cannabis Infused Edibles, Infused Non- Edibles, Concentrate, Immature Plants or Seeds
- All Harvest Lots, Harvest Lot Packages, Test Samples, Production Runs and Production Batches are **Packages** of Cannabis Products

Harvest Lot, Harvest Lot Package

- A **Harvest Lot** is a strain specific Batch of dried, raw Cannabis Buds and Trim that are produced grouped together after a harvest
 - All **Harvest Lots** are packaged into **Harvest Lot Packages**
 - Not all **Harvest Lot Packages** contain the entire **Harvest Lots**
 - **Harvest Lot Packages** are limited in size:
 - 5 lbs per Lot of Bud
 - 15 lbs per Lot of Trim
 - 125 lbs per Lot of whole wet plants (Live Rosin Extraction)

Production Run & Production Batch Package

- A **Production Run** is your initial extraction of Concentrate which you intend to use in the production of additional infused products
 - All **Production Runs** are **Production Batches**
 - Not all **Production Batches** are **Production Runs**
- A **Production Batch** is created any time an item is chemically altered or transformed to create a new and completely different item, for example:
 - Converting plant material into a Concentrate
 - Converting Concentrate (Oil or Butter) into Infused Edibles or Infused Non-Edibles

Medical to Recreational Transfers

Detailed below is some guidance on re-packaging of product and transferring between Medical and Recreational Licenses

- If product is intended to be sold as Recreational, it must be packaged, transferred from, and received by a Recreational License
- If product is intended to be sold as Medical, it must be packaged, transferred from, and received by a Medical License
- If product is eligible to be sold as Medical or Recreational it should be grown and packaged as Recreational product
 - It can then be re-packaged and/or designated as Medical by the Stores or Processors
- **If product is not packaged correctly or transferred to the correct license in metrc the transfer should be rejected:**
 - Send the packages back to the originating facility
 - Repackage them correctly
 - Resend the transfer

Producer

- Producers may repackage product from Medical to Recreational
- Producers may transfer product from their Medical to their Recreational License
- Producers **MUST** repackage medical product as recreational product if it is intended for Recreational sale
 - Producers may **ONLY** transfer Medical product to a Recreational License if it is to their own, associated, dual-licensed, Recreational facility
 - If the product is intended to be sold as Recreational then you must follow the transportation requirements and use distributors

Store

- Retail Stores may **NOT** repackage product from Medical to Recreational
- Retail Stores may **NOT** transfer product from their Medical License to their Recreational License
 - Retail stores may **ONLY** transfer product back to the original source and all recreational product must be delivered by a distributor in accordance with State rules and regulations

Processor

- Processors may repackage product from Medical to Recreational
- Processors may transfer product from their Medical to their Recreational License
- Processors **MUST** repackage recreational product as Medical product if it exceeds the potency limits established by the State for Medical Grade product (Edibles)
 - Processors may **ONLY** transfer Recreational product to a Medical License if it is to their own, associated, dual-licensed, Medical facility
 - This product must be re-packaged under the Medical License
 - This product must have a Medical package Tag
 - This product may **ONLY** be transferred to a Licensed Medical facility

Harvests, Lots & Lab Testing

Each Harvest Lot Package, Production Run & Production Batch must be submitted for the required Lab Testing!

- Harvest Lot Packages
 - You cannot create a 20 lb package from a Harvest and then create your 5 lb Lots
 - Create 5 lb Lots directly from the Harvest
- A Test Sample must be created for EACH 5 lb. Harvest Lot Package of Raw Cannabis Product (Bud or Trim)
- A Test Sample must be created for EACH Production Run/Batch of Concentrate, Cannabis Infused Edibles and Infused Non-Edibles.
