Applying a 10% variance on Edibles

Through the passage of <u>HB 229</u>, a 10% variance on the personal possession limits allowed for edibles became effective October 1st, 2023. Metrc users will no longer have to create a new item in Metrc for the same item that varies in potency. Per direction from the Montana CCD, edibles that test between 90 and 110mg of THC can be categorized as 100mg. The variance is accounted for in the Item and does not infringe on cardholder allotments or flag the licensee for an oversell.




Figure 1: Creating Items with the 10% edibles variance

The following is an example of a Package that correctly factors in the 10% variance. The item shown is a batch of Edibles that test between 90 and 110mg of THC, however, notice that it is packaged using the Item – **100mg Solventless Chocolate Drops.** This Item accounts for the variance and does not infringe on cardholder allotments or flag the licensee for an oversell. If this same batch tested below 90mg or above 110mg, a new Item would need to be created to accurately represent the product – **see Figure 1**.
