Reason: Updates to the definition of MMCEU		

Greetings,

Metrc in conjunction with the Mississippi Medical Cannabis Program (MMCP) is pleased to provide information on the changes included with SB 2748. Changes to cannabis concentrate and infused products are listed below.

- 210 (ii) One (1) gram of THC in a medical cannabis concentrate; or
- 212 (iii) One * * * (1) gram of THC in an infused product.

Please read on for more information regarding these changes.

What Changes on 7/1/2025

To meet the needs for these changes, all final form item categories for Cannabis Concentrate Products will need to have the unit THC added by the Processor before they can be sold. This field will be available for these items on July 1, 2025. **Note:** THC content cannot be added prior to the July 1, 2025, as patient allotments will continue to deduct based on item weight up until this date. Please be sure to update all items by July 8th 2025.

Processors and Dispensaries will need to quarantine all existing concentrate products until a Unit THC content is assigned. Each licensee (Dispensaries and Processors) is responsible for verifying the Unit THC content in METRC prior to removal from quarantine.

How to add THC content to an existing item (processors):

Similar to the edible 10% variance in Rule 6.1.4.10, MMCP will be issuing a temporary variance of 10 % +or- for METRC Item Configuration of concentrate THC mg items for any existing item sets that have been assigned to multiple batches prior to July 1, 2025. Processors should assign the average testing value related to that item. New production batches of concentrate items, created after July 1, 2025, should be created with new items that will be updated to match the potency test values until otherwise instructed by MMCP.

Please note that this does not override the statutory requirement capping concentrates at 60%.


If an existing item has test results that fall outside of this 10 % range, please do not update this item & consult with MMCP regarding next steps for correction via mclicensing@msdh.ms.gov.

Unit THC Content may be found via COAs associated with batches. To find this, navigate to the **Packages** area > select **Active/Inactive** > Select the drop-down carrot > Select the **Lab Results** > Select the **Doc Button**.

For concentrate weight-based items (Infused Pre-rolls, Infused Flower, Concentrate), the value assigned is the THC mg/g, the weight sold will capture the total THC mg content sold. EX: 1.5 g sale of conc. infused pre-rolls assigned at 420 mg Unit THC will assign a deduction of 630 mg.

For concentrate (each) items, in contrast, these will deduct the Unit THC value assigned regardless of the concentrate weight assigned. EX: a .5 g Vape Cart with a 250 mg Unit THC will assign a deduction of 250 mg the same as a 1 g Vape cart with a 250 mg Unit THC.

Navigate to the **Admin** area > select **Items** > highlight the item you want to update and select the **Edit Item** button > add in your Unit THC Content in the appropriate field and save your item – **see Figure 1**. If unable to edit the item, a new item will need to be created with the correct item information.

If an item has been discontinued, it will not be able to be updated. Processors, please consult with MMCP regarding next steps for correction via mclicensing@msdh.ms.gov.

How to see if THC content has been added to an existing item:

Per MMCP & ABC-DOR, each licensee (Dispensaries and Processors) is responsible for verifying the Unit THC content in METRC prior to removal from quarantine and making sales to patients.

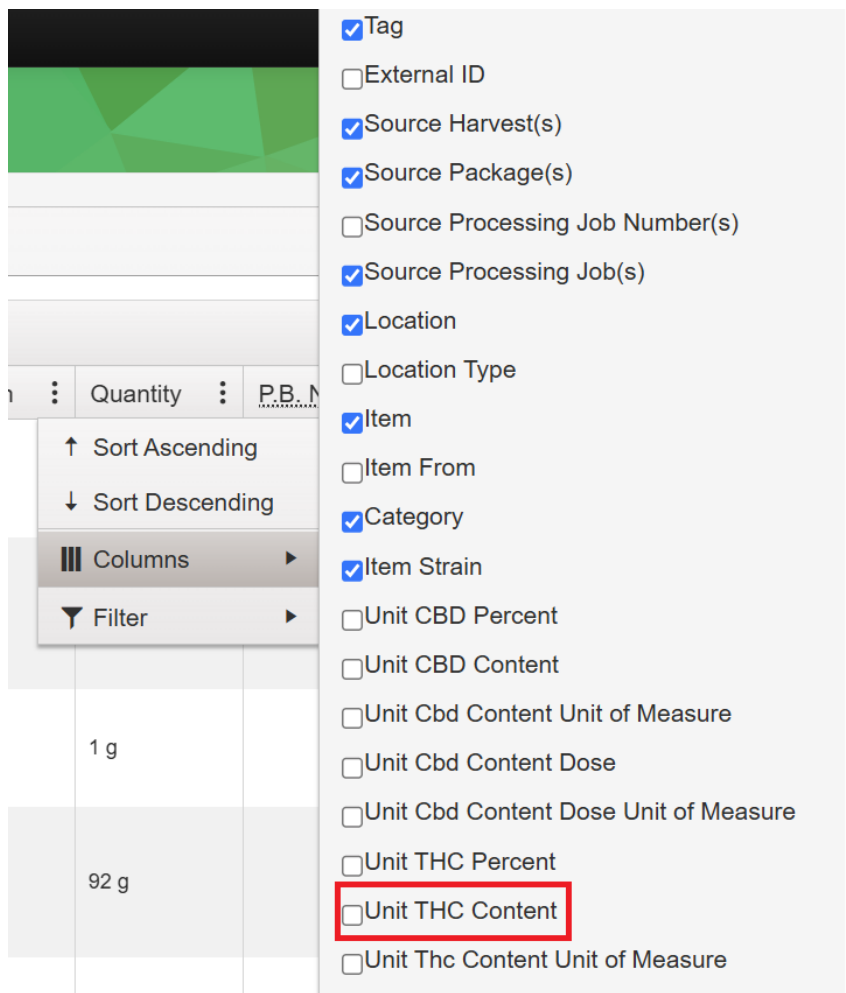


Figure 2: Adding the column for Unit THC Content

To add the column view for the unit THC column from the package tab select the three dots to the right of any column header and check the box for Unit THC Content. **see Figure 2**, Once enabled, the Unit THC content for all packages will be displayed. **see Figure 3**, for an example of concentrate items missing Unit THC information.

Once a package has been verified to have an assigned Unit THC content, it may be removed from quarantine and sales to patients may resume from that package. EX: In **Figure 3**, packages ending in 0039 & 0038 may be removed from quarantine and have patient sales continue as normal. Packages ending in 0032 & 0026 still need the Unit THC content assigned and will remain in quarantine.

Verification of Unit THC content for newly received items:

Manifest verification:

- When receiving an incoming manifest, determine that the item allotment information is entered.
See Figure 4. Package 1 has a unit THC assigned, but package 2 does not.
- If there is a discrepancy in the item allotment:
 - Reject item from manifest OR
 - Accept and quarantine items with discrepancies.
- Contact the originating facility that sent the item to correct the unit item allotment.
 - The Originating facility corrects the item and notifies other recipients of the item error.
 - If other recipients have made patient sales, the originating facility will notify MMCP immediately.

Sales Receipts Verification:

- Verify via sales receipts/patient limits that the item allotment information is calculated correctly.
 - If there is a discrepancy in the item allotments for sales receipts, please quarantine or hold the package so that no further sales will be made.
- Please reach out to the MMCP right away via the link at www.mmcp.ms.gov/businesses > Form: [Dispensary Item Abnormal Limit Report](#). This notification helps ensure that patient limits are being calculated correctly within the Metrc system.
- After the MMCP has confirmed the processor has corrected the item, then please contact Metrc Support to assist you with editing and updating your sales.
