Metrc, in conjunction with the OCM, would like to inform Minnesota licensees of updates made to the available processing job categories in Metrc. These changes will go into effect on 08/07/2026. Please note that the previous processing job categories should be discontinued and no longer used as of this date.

## Current Processing Job Categories

The processing job categories below are currently available within Metrc. This list will be updated as of 08/07/2026.

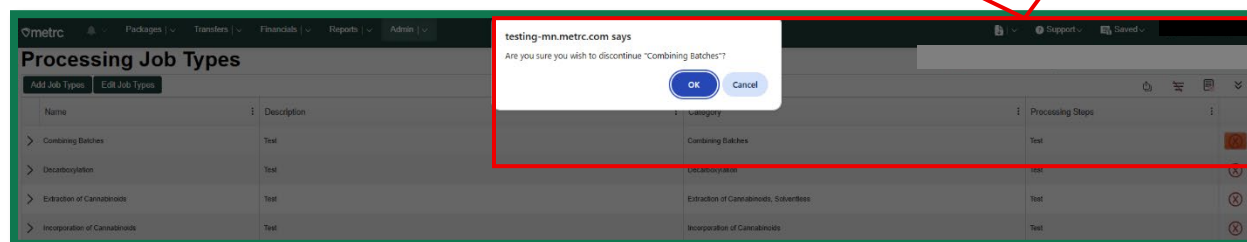
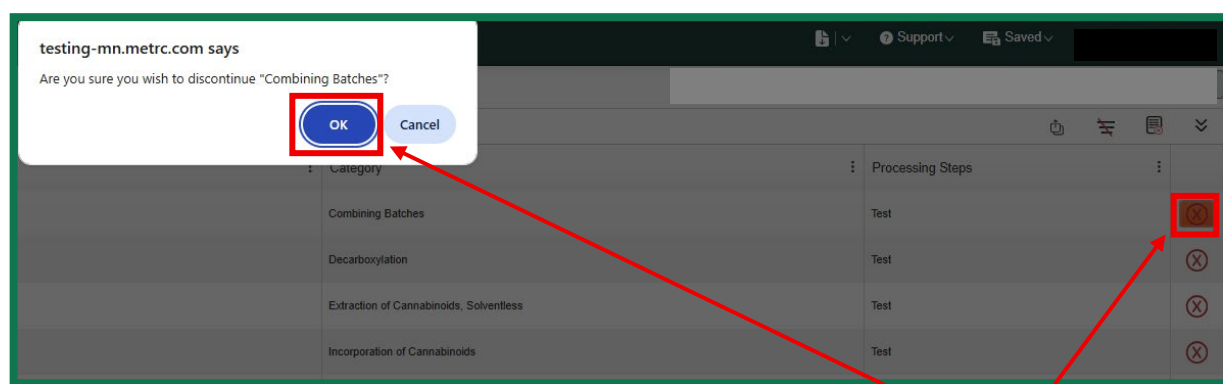
- Combining Batches
- Decarboxylation
- Extraction of Cannabinoids
- Filling Vape Cartridges
- Incorporation of Cannabinoids
- Making Artificially Derived Cannabinoids (ADCs)
- Preroll Production

The processing job categories below will no longer be available for use within Metrc as of 10/01/2026 and any processing job types using these categories should be discontinued:

- Combining Batches
- Extraction of Cannabinoids
- Incorporation of Cannabinoids
- Splitting a Batch for R&D Testing

To discontinue a processing job type, navigate to the “Processing Job Types” area under the “Admin” tab and use the “Category” column to identify any processing job types that are using any of the inactive processing job categories.

Once the appropriate processing job types have been identified, use the “x” button the far right of that line item to discontinue the processing job type and confirm – see **Figure 1**.
